PRESCRIPTION MEDICINES

CODE OF PRACTICE AUTHORITY

Merck Sharp & Dohme Limited has breached the Code of Practice for the Pharmaceutical Industry and brought discredit upon, and reduced confidence in, the pharmaceutical industry.

For entertaining health professionals and their spouses at a meeting with no clear educational content in an unsuitable venue, Merck Sharp & Dohme was ruled in breach of the following clauses of the Code:

- Clause 2 Bringing discredit upon, and reducing confidence in, the pharmaceutical industry.
- Clause 9.1 Failing to maintain high standards.
- Clause 19.1 Providing inappropriate hospitality to health professionals (and their spouses) that was not secondary to the main purpose of the meeting in a venue that was not suitable for an educational/scientific meeting.
